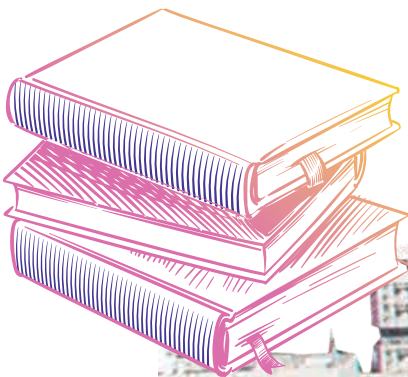
HKIEd was granted self-accrediting status in teacher education programmes by the Hong Kong Government.

HKIEd became one of eight publicly funded tertiary institutions under the aegis of the University Grants Committee(UGC).

1994

HKIEd was established by amalgamating the five Colleges of Education.

2016

HKIEd was retitled The Education University of Hong Kong (EdUHK).

2018

EdUHK was granted full self-accrediting status for all its programme offerings.

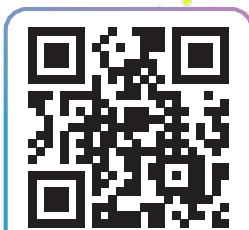


Faculty of Humanities (FHM)

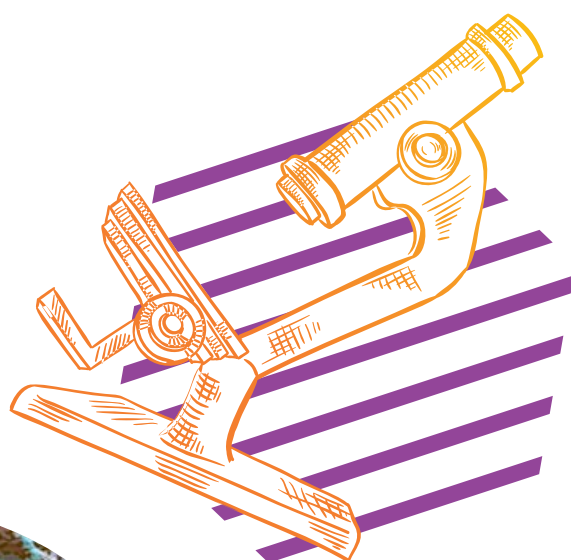
Graduate School (GS)

Established in 2010, the Graduate School (GS) is responsible for managing the University's Research Postgraduate programmes (Doctor of Philosophy and Master of Philosophy), as well as the cross-faculty Doctor of Education and Master of Education programmes. The School serves as an academic platform for professional doctorates and taught master's programmes with the aim of promoting maximum synergy between the higher degree programmes and ensuring that they meet international standards. The School works closely with the various academic units to develop an active research environment on campus and aims to provide first-class research training for research postgraduate students.

Since 2018, **EdUHK has won 67 awards for its innovations** at international invention expos in Canada, Germany, Switzerland, Taiwan and the USA. Six innovations have been licensed to industrial partners for commercial/educational use, which will generate at least HK\$300,000 income to EdUHK.

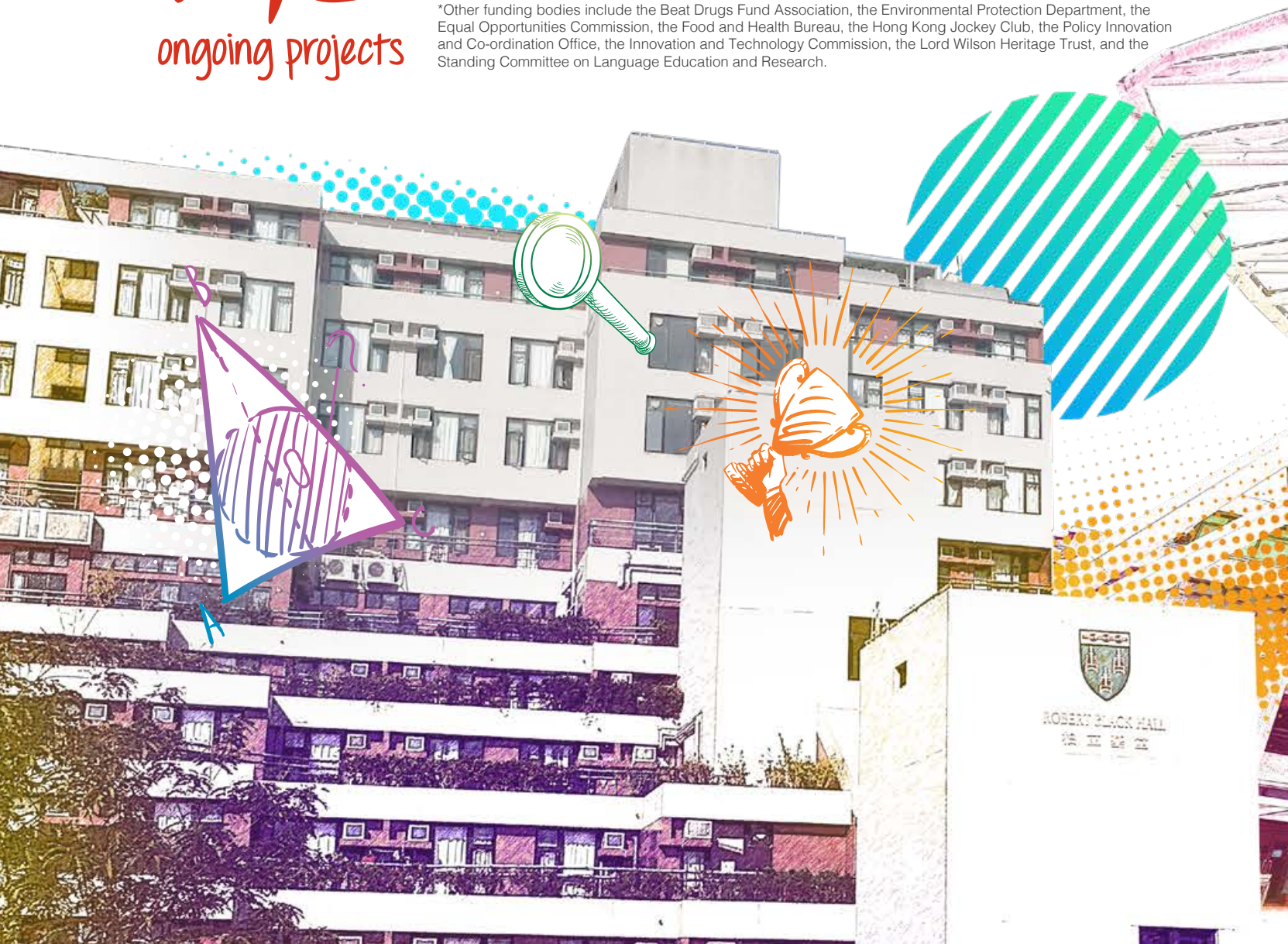

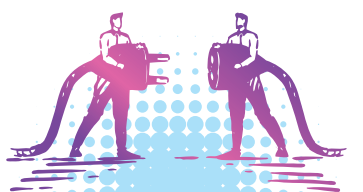

Our academics and researchers **are involved in 193 ongoing projects**, which have received HK\$153.26 million in funding from the Research Grants Council (RGC) and other funding bodies*, bearing a testament to our research capacity as a young and thriving university.

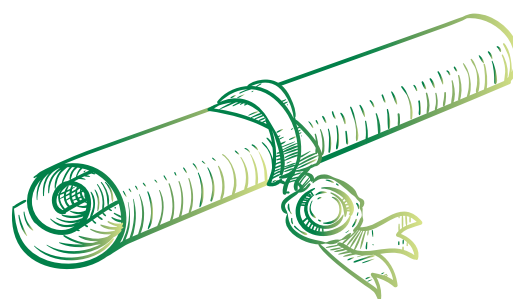
Scholarships for non-local students

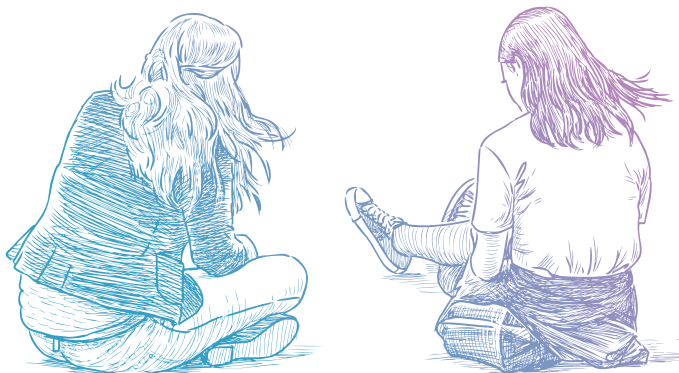
- **EdUHK Entrance Scholarship Scheme**
 - Full Scholarship: covers full tuition fees, on-campus accommodation fees, academic and living allowances
 - Tuition Scholarship: provides full tuition fees
 - Half Tuition Scholarship: covers half of the tuition fees
- **Subject Scholarship:**
 - designated for programmes or areas of study
- **Student Exchange Scholarship:**
 - for semester-long outbound student exchange programmes
- **Other Scholarships:**
 - e.g. scholarship for outbound activities or special talents

- **Belt and Road Scholarship (Designated Countries)**
– for students from Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and Myanmar

- **Belt and Road Scholarship (Research Postgraduate)**



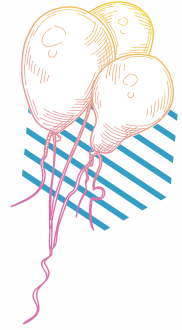

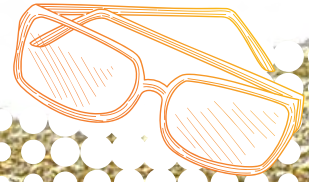

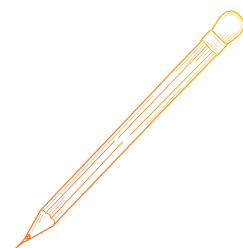

Student accommodation and hall life

Our student residential halls, situated among lush and wooded hills, are convenient, secure and comfortable. There are four on-campus student halls – Northcote Hall, Grantham Hall, Robert Black Hall, and the Jockey Club Student Quarters – providing about 2,200 residential places for full-time undergraduate and postgraduate students of University Grants Committee-funded programmes and exchange students.



Hall residents can supplement their formal classroom learning through a variety of stimulating educational activities, including **inspirational talks from experts in various fields, overseas experiential learning tours, and life skills workshops**, all of which are held regularly.

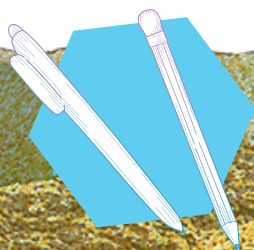

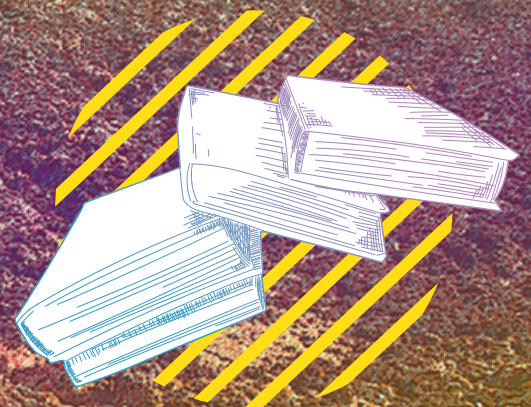

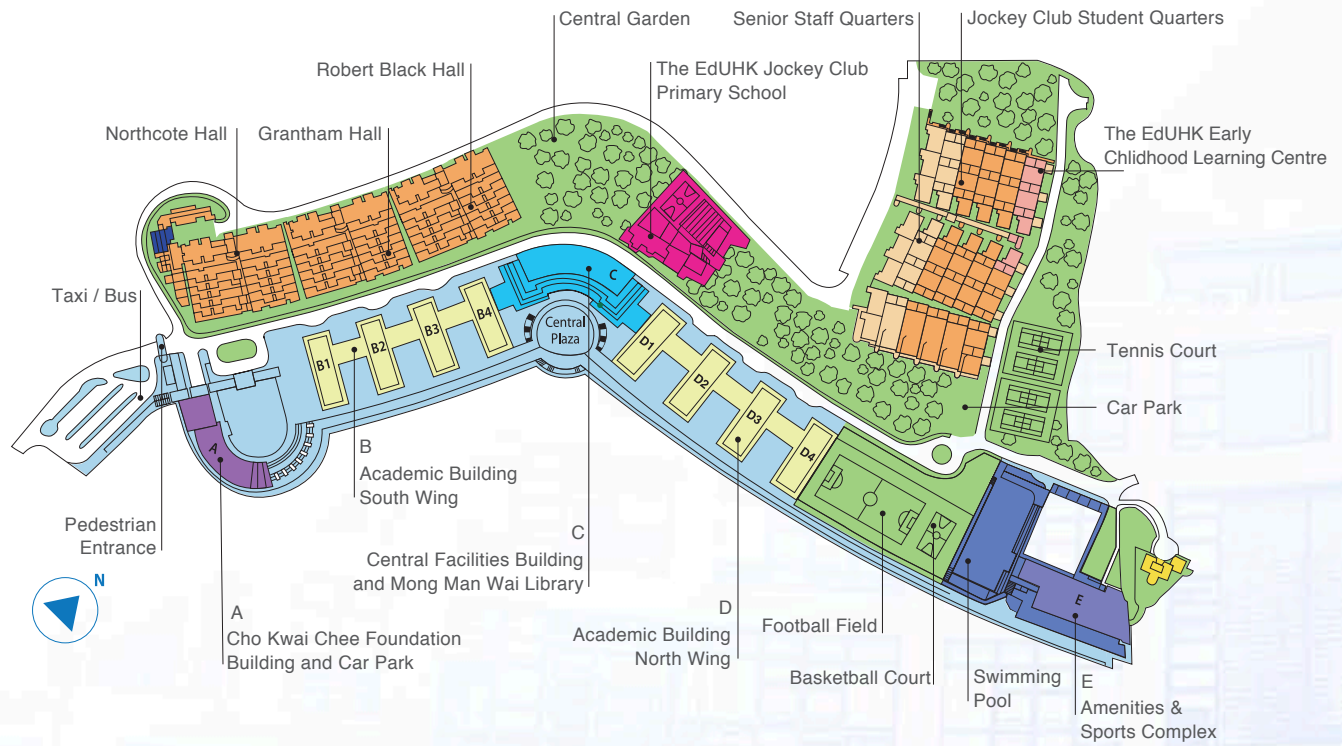
